Foothills Gateway, Inc. is a private non-profit organization providing services to county residents with developmental disabilities to help them achieve their maximum potential and independence. Case management services are provided to help individuals identify, locate and coordinate needed services and support. Early childhood intervention services are designed to meet the developmental needs of infants and toddlers, provide referrals, disseminate information and advocate for the family. Family support services offer support funds to families with children of any age with developmental disabilities who are living at home. Community services provide employment, vocational and living skills development. Foothills Gateway also coordinates and/or provides residential services.
