Larimer Center for Mental Health [LCMH] is a private, non-profit mental health center serving Larimer County. LCMH provides counseling for persons with mental illness and stress related disorders using individual, family, and group therapy in outpatient or half-way house settings. Special services for seniors, people with terminal illness and post-traumatic stress disorder are also available. Walk-in assessment for mental health emergencies are available during office hours as well as a 24-hour telephone crisis intervention service.

AGENCY/ORGANIZATION DESCRIPTION

The Detention Center, an agency of Larimer County, houses male and female adults charged with criminal offenses. It also holds juveniles age 17 and under whom are being charged for criminal offenses as adults. Persons convicted and sentenced to the Detention Center are held until their sentences are complete. Those persons charged with criminal offenses who are unable to post bond are also held at the Detention Center throughout the entire court process. Persons convicted and sentenced to the Colorado State Department of Corrections for crimes committed in Larimer County remain at the Detention Center until space is available elsewhere.
