profile of the uninsured



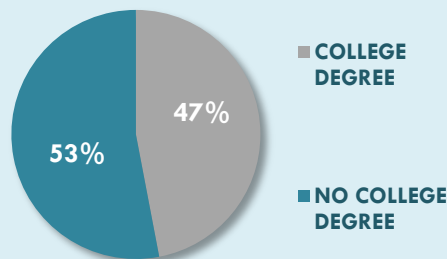
Health insurance coverage helps people get the health care they need. Data gathered from the Health District of Northern Larimer County's Community Health Survey revealed that 1 in 10 (approximately 15,000) of adult residents of the Health District were uninsured in late 2013. In 2014, the Affordable Care Act was implemented, enabling many uninsured residents to gain health insurance coverage.

About half of all uninsured adults reported having a college degree.

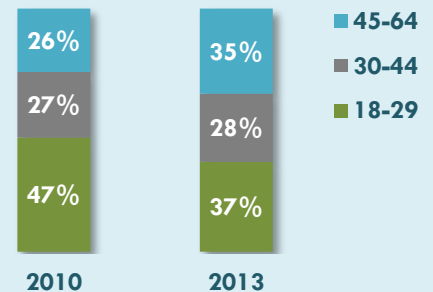
EDUCATIONAL STATUS OF UNINSURED ADULTS

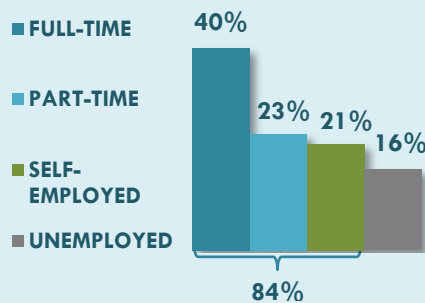

A large majority (84%) of uninsured adults are employed.

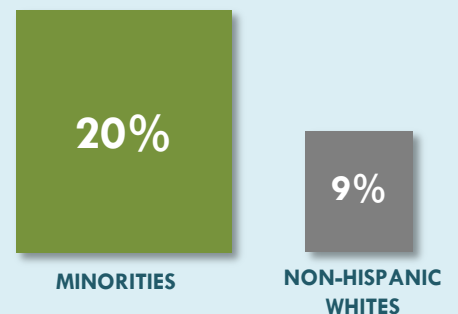
EMPLOYMENT STATUS OF UNINSURED ADULTS

Minorities are more than twice as likely to be uninsured than non-Hispanic whites.

Only 1 in 3

uninsured adults reported having a regular healthcare provider.



Good access to care is highly related to having health insurance coverage.

Of those with insurance, 73% of respondents reported they have a particular doctor or nurse who they consider to be their regular care provider. However, for adults without health insurance, only 32% report having a regular health-care provider.

Additionally, uninsured respondents rated their access to care as “fair or poor” 4 times more (52%) than overall respondents (13%) did.



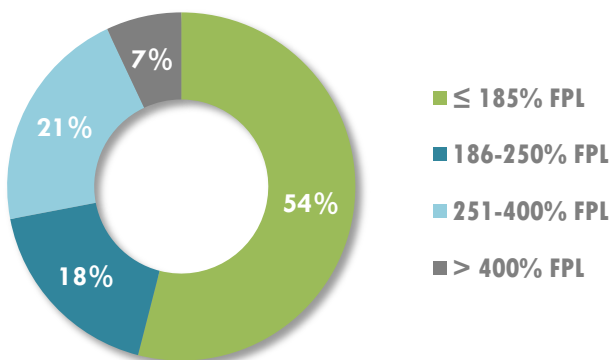

HOUSEHOLD INCOME & HEALTH INSURANCE

Over half (54%) of uninsured adults reported they had household incomes at or below 185% Federal Poverty Level (FPL).

More than 1 in 5 (21%) uninsured adults reported they had moderate household incomes.

INCOME LEVELS OF THE UNINSURED



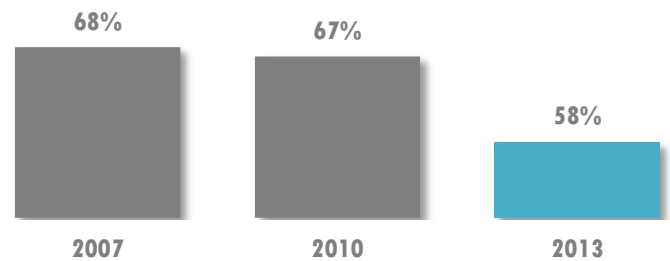
* From previous page and above: Working-aged adults are those under 65. Adults 65+ are not included in the charts due to Medicare eligibility for adults this age.

EMPLOYER – PROVIDED INSURANCE

The percent of working-aged adults* that reported they had employer-sponsored health insurance decreased from 68% in 2010 to 58% in 2013.

Between 2007 and 2010, respondents reporting that they had employer-sponsored health insurance remained steady, between 68% and 67%. Numbers reported in 2013 are the lowest rates of employer-provided healthcare seen in over a decade in Health District Surveys.

HEALTH INSURANCE & HEALTH STATUS

Those who reported having insurance rated their health as “excellent” or “very good” (64%), more often than those without insurance of any kind (53%), see chart below.
