DATA SUMMARY OF FORT COLLINS-SPECIFIC RESPONDENTS REGARDING MARIJUANA: USE OF CANNABIS AND ATTITUDES TOWARD POLICIES ALLOWING RETAIL MARIJUANA

# **About the Community Health Survey**

Since 1995, every three years the Health District of Northern Larimer County has conducted a community health assessment to determine the health status and healthcare needs of Health District residents. This assessment is used to guide the planning, implementation, and evaluation of services that the Health District provides. This triennial process is used so that health status trends may be followed and heath service needs within the community can be understood on a regular basis.

The assessment has three main components:

- 1. A written community health survey
- 2. A series of community discussion groups
- 3. A review of other local, state, and national health data and health trends

2,819 usable surveys were returned from across Larimer County, with a preliminary estimated response rate of about 40%. The data in this report includes only those responses from surveys sent to Fort Collins zip codes (zip codes 80521 through 80528). Data is statistically weighted by age and gender to the estimated population of Larimer County in 2013 from the Colorado Demography Office, to improve representation of underrepresented groups in the sample.

#### Summary

In the 2013 Community Health Survey conducted by the Health District of Northern Larimer County, respondents were asked several related questions about their past and current use of cannabis. In addition, participants were asked about their attitudes on policies that would allow retail marijuana stores and cultivation facilities.

Among respondents residing in Fort Collins zip codes, roughly 52% reported that they had ever, even once, used marijuana. About 18% of Fort Collins residents have used marijuana in past twelve months, whether for medicinal or recreational purposes. Use rates did not vary significantly between men and women, but younger Fort Collins residents (ages 18 to 29) are more likely to have ever used and are more often reported being current users.

Asked about their attitudes toward policies allowing operation of marijuana retail stores and cultivation facilities, more Fort Collins residents favor allowing the establishments than oppose: about 45% favor these policies and about 40% oppose (with 15% providing no opinion). Like with marijuana use, these results are related to the age of respondents; 59% of those ages 18 to 29 favor allowing marijuana retail stores (27% oppose) and 63% of those over 70 years oppose these policies (25% favor). These two age groups (the youngest and oldest) also have the strongest feelings toward these policies, answering "strongly favor" or "strongly oppose" most often. As might be expected, respondents' current or prior use of marijuana also correlated with support for policies allowing operation of marijuana retail stores and cultivation facilities.



# Fort Collins residents' use of marijuana — Past and Current


In the 2013 Community Health Survey conducted by the Health District of Northern Larimer County, households were asked, "Have you ever, even once, used marijuana (cannabis)?" This was followed with, "If yes, have you used marijuana (cannabis) in the past 12 months for recreational or medicinal purposes?" Of 1492 survey respondents residing in Fort Collins zip codes, 49 (3%) did not answer the first of these questions.

Overall, 44% of respondents report never using marijuana, while 52% have used it, if only once; 18% report having used marijuana for recreational or medicinal purposes in the past 12 months. These results are strongly related to age, with the likelihood of a person reporting that they had never used marijuana increasing with age and the likelihood of a person reporting their being a current user decreasing with age. Persons aged 18-29 most frequently reported having ever used marijuana and being current users (used in the last twelve months).

# Marijuana (cannabis) use by gender in Fort Collins residents<sup>2</sup>





## Fort Collins residents attitudes toward policies allowing marijuana retail stores and cultivation facilities


In the 2013 Community Health Survey conducted by the Health District of Northern Larimer County, households were asked if they favored or opposed policies that would "Allow operation of marijuana retail stores and cultivation facilities." Answers included "strongly favor," "favor," "no opinion," "oppose", and "strongly oppose." Of 1492 respondents from Fort Collins zip codes, 18 did not respond to this question, and about 15% responded with "no opinion."

Across the Fort Collins population, 45% support policies that would allow operation of marijuana retail stores and cultivation facilities, and 39.6% oppose these policies. 15% reported having no opinion. A majority of responses fell at one extreme of responses or the other: 28% strongly oppose and 24% strongly favor.




Support and opposition to policies allowing marijuana facilities correlated with respondents' ages: older residents are more likely to oppose and younger residents are more likely to favor the policies.

Finally, current or past use of marijuana is also strongly correlated with support for policies allowing marijuana retail stores and cultivation facilities.

## About the data included in this summary

The Health District of Northern Larimer County (Health District) has conducted a survey of Larimer County residents every three years beginning in 1995. Our seventh and most recent survey, The 2013 Community Health Survey, was a written, 16-page, 83-question survey designed to collect data on a variety of health conditions and behaviors, healthcare affordability and coverage, access to healthcare and need for various services.

The Health District has contracted with the Wyoming Survey & Analysis Center (WYSAC) to administer the survey, collect and clean the data and conduct preliminary data analysis. In the fall of 2013, a random-sample list of approximately 7,300 households with mailable addresses in Larimer County was obtained, with selected households contacted by mail up to five times. Mailed households were given the option of completing the survey on-line, and about one-third of completed surveys were completed this way. As of February 19, 2014 total 2,819 usable surveys were returned, with an estimated response rate of about 40%.


